## 28<sup>th</sup> APRIL 2024 5<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY OF EASTER

**THEME:** The New Covenant

**SENTENCE:** In this is love, not that we loved God but that God loved us. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another.

1 John 4:10–11.

#### **COLLECT:**

Christ of the new covenant, give us the happiness to share, with full measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, all that you give us.

Hear this prayer for your love's sake. Amen.

#### **READINGS:**

**Acts 8:26-40**. Persecution of the early church broke out in Jerusalem, and many Christians were scattered. The church also began to admit non-Jews to its fellowship, and this included an Ethiopian

**1 John 4:7-21.** The first letter of John is more a treatise or a sermon from a leader of the Johannine church at the end of the first century AD. The author stresses that our Christian love stems from God's love for us.

**Psalm 22:25-31.** Future generations shall be told about the Lord, and proclaim his deliverance.

**John 15:1-8**. As part of the long address to the disciples at the Last Supper in John's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the intimate relationship that exists between himself and his followers; as close as branches to the vine.

#### A PRAYER FOR PEACE

Compassionate and gracious God we ask for your intervention, through men, women, and organisations of authority, to restore peace in nations engaged in armed conflict throughout each continent of our world. Protect and sustain all who are bringing medical aid, food, shelter, and comfort to the innocent victims of such conflict. This we ask in the name of Jesus, The Prince of Peace. Amen.

#### THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS.

In this passage, Jesus stresses the need for his hearers (the branches,) to dwell deeply in him (the vine.) This is in order that they may be fruitful. But an additional condition is that fruitful branches must be open to being pruned by the vine-grower (God the Father) to enable yet more fruit. There is a wonderful picture here of God continually tending, shaping and re-shaping us over time, in order that our lives bear as much fruit as possible. This is God's work, not ours, but we must stay 'rooted and grafted' into Jesus the vine.

#### Psalm 22:25-31.

25 I will praise you in the great assembly.

I will fulfil my vows in the presence of those who worship you.

26 The poor will eat and be satisfied.

All who seek the Lord will praise him.

Their hearts will rejoice with everlasting joy.

27 The whole earth will acknowledge the Lord and return to him.

All the families of the nations will bow down before him.

28 For royal power belongs to the Lord.

He rules all the nations.

29 Let the rich of the earth feast and worship.

Bow before him, all who are mortal, all whose lives will end as dust.

30 Our children will also serve him.

Future generations will hear about the wonders of the Lord.

31 His righteous acts will be told to those not yet born.

They will hear about everything he has done.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit As it was, is now, and shall be for ever. Amen.
